## ***CINAHL Database moving from OVID to EBSCO***

The Cumulative Index of Nursing and Allied Health Literature (CINAHL) database will be available on a different interface. Originally provided by OVID, CINAHL has been purchased by EBSCO Company. Beginning January 2008, EBSCO will be the exclusive provider of CINAHL.

The new interface *CINAHL Plus with Full-Text*, includes access to 620 full-text journals, 218 books and monographs, Continuing Education Modules and Research Instrument Records among other new features.

The Library will have concurrent access to both the OVID and EBSCO interfaces through the end of December, 2007. Beginning in 2008, there will only be access to the EBSCO version.

Please begin using CINAHL Plus with Full Text from EBSCO to become familiar with it and be ready for the changeover in the New Year.
